Covid process for visiting teams to the Hampton Community Centre

Players arrive at the rink 15 minutes before game time.

Have own team covid host/manager actively screen players and provide contact tracing document to home team covid host.

Players and coaches enter the rink as one group and will be directed to appropriate dressing rooms.

Community masks must be worn inside the arena and in the dressing room until the team is permitted to enter the ice surface.

Sanitize hands at one of the two dispensers in the lobby.

At times there may be the need to use 2 locker rooms per team, disperse coaching staff appropriately.

There is no standing around in the hallways or mezzanine area of the arena, coaches must stay in the rooms with the players. There is no lining up in the hallway while waiting to enter the ice surface.

Once the players have entered the ice surface parents must be covid screened and contact tracing.

HMHA has a limit of 1 spectator per player, and cannot exceed the limits imposed by the Town of Hampton. Rostered staff not actively participating on the bench are considered spectators. Bench personnel should be 3 staff on the bench, keeping with HNB guidelines. **No exceptions.**

Visiting team and home team hosts/managers must work to process parents as quickly as possible. The main door will be closed no more than 10 minutes after game start time. Contact tracing sheets from visiting team are to be handed to home team covid host. Use the attached sheet for contact tracing.

Spectators are permitted to sit in the top two rows of the stands.

Community masks must be worn at all times.

No outside food or beverages are permitted in the rink.

Parents will be instructed to leave the building when the game is finished. There is no loitering in the stands. To exit the building players and parents must use the side door located between the 2 sets of bleachers.

Players will have a maximum of 15 minutes to vacate the rooms and the building. They will also exit out the side door between the bleachers.

The home team covid host and/or manager will check dressing rooms for cleanliness and ensure all persons are out of the building.

Non compliance of players or spectators will result in a request to comply, a request to leave the facility and as a last option, game play will be stopped and all persons will vacate the premises.

We all have to work together to keep playing hockey in Southern New Brunswick.
